READ THIS FIRST

Your Kaua'i Quick Start Guide

Planning a North Shore trip can feel overwhelming. Here's what matters most — distilled into one page.

★ BOOK YOUR BASE FIRST

The North Shore has limited vacation rentals. Good ones book 6–12 months ahead during peak season (June–August, December). The right home base makes everything else easier. River Estate gives you direct river access, paddle-to-beach, and a location between Hanalei and Hā'ēna.

★ RESERVE THESE IMMEDIATELY

Hā'ēna State Park (gohaena.com) — books 30 days out, sells out in hours. Helicopter tours — fill months ahead. Bar Acuda — reserve 30 days out for dinner. Car rental — midsize SUV, not a convertible.

★ UNDERSTAND THE WEATHER

Kaua'i has microclimates. The North Shore is the wettest side — and also the lushest. A passing shower is normal. It usually passes in 15 minutes. Pack a light rain jacket and you're set. The silver lining: rain makes the waterfalls roar.

★ WHY LOCATION MATTERS

River Estate sits mid-way between Hanalei and Hā'ēna. Ten minutes to town, ten minutes to Tunnels Beach. You're close enough to grab anything you forgot, far enough to feel completely away.

★ QUICK ARRIVAL CHECKLIST

- ✓ Book midsize SUV rental — stop at Costco/Safeway near airport for groceries
- ✓ Set Hā'ena State Park alert for your 30-day window — gohaena.com
- ✓ Pack: light rain jacket, reef-safe sunscreen, water shoes, reusable bags
- ✓ Download maps offline — cell service is spotty past Hanalei

★ MARK'S NOTE

I tell every guest the same thing: your first day, do nothing. Arrive. Settle in. Walk the property. Sit by the river. Let the island find you. Everything else flows from that one decision.

SECTION 01

Why River Estate Feels Different

Most vacation rentals give you a place to sleep. River Estate gives you a place to live — on the river, among the trees, steps from the ocean.

★ RIVERFRONT PRIVACY

The Wainiha River runs right beside the entire River Estate property. You'll leave the rest of the world behind as soon as you enter the private driveway. Paddle downstream — five minutes later, you're on a secluded beach where the river meets the ocean.

★ PADDLE-TO-BEACH LIVING

No fighting for parking. No hauling gear across hot sand. You paddle out the back door. That's not a feature you'll find in any hotel brochure.

★ BOTANICAL SETTING

Tangerine, orange, grapefruit and mango trees grow right on the property. You'll pick breakfast from the trees outside your door in season. Plumeria, hibiscus, and torch ginger dot the property along with other exotic tropical plants that create a magical Hawaiian environment.

★ CLOSE TO EVERYTHING

Ten minutes to Hanalei. Ten minutes to Tunnels. Fifteen to Kē'ē Beach. You're central to the best the North Shore offers without being in the middle of it.

SECTION 02

North Shore Orientation

From Līhu'e Airport to the end of the road at Kē'ē Beach — here's how the North Shore unfolds.

Līhu'e Airport (LIH)

45–60 minutes from the North Shore. Pick up your supplies and any essentials you'll need at Costco or Safeway on the way out. You'll be glad you did.

Princeville

First North Shore town. Golf courses, resort amenities, Queen's Bath (go early, check surf). The Hanalei Valley overlook from the highway is one of the most photographed views on Earth.

Hanalei Town & Bay

The heart of it all. One main road, taro fields on both sides, a bay so perfect it aches. Walk the pier at sunset. Saturdays: the farmers' market is non-negotiable.

Wainiha & River Estate

Quiet, lush stretch past Hanalei. This is where the river meets the sea. Most visitors drive right past without knowing this is where the magic lives.



Hā'ēna & Tunnels Beach

World-class snorkeling and surfing. Sea turtles. Protected reef and lagoon. Requires advance reservation at gohaena.com. Arrive before 8 AM.

Kē'ē Beach & Nā Pali Trailhead

End of the road. Raw, powerful, sacred. Even the first two miles of the Kalalau Trail will rewire something inside you. The sunset here is a religious experience.

Beyond the North Shore

Waimea Canyon (45 min drive): the "Grand Canyon of the Pacific," best before 11 AM. Kokō'ē State Park (further up): 4,000-foot views above the clouds. Hanapepe Art Town (1 hr): Friday evening art walk.

★ MARK'S NOTE

The drive from Princeville to Kē'ē is 30 minutes on a two-lane road with one-lane bridges. Leave early. Wave at everyone. That's how it works here.

★ WHERE MOST VISITORS CHOOSE WRONG

North Shore → Lush, dramatic, uncrowded. This is where you belong. **South Shore (Po'ipū)** → Sunnier but developed, crowded beaches, tourist restaurants. **East Side (Kapa'a)** → Convenient to airport, not why you flew 2,500 miles. **West Side** → Waimea Canyon is spectacular — as a day trip, not a home base.

SECTION 03

Weather, Microclimates & Kaua'i Weather

Kaua'i has various microclimates. The North Shore (Hanalei/Hā'ēna) gets 40–60 inches of rain a year, sometimes more. The South Shore (Po'ipū) gets 30–40 and the West Shore (Waimea) gets 20–30. That's what makes the North Shore impossibly green, with waterfalls spilling down every mountainside and the South and West sides arid and dry. Up North, passing showers last about 15 minutes. Sun comes back out, colors deepen, air feels cleaner. This is why Kaua'i is called the Garden Island.

🌧️ RAINY-DAY IDEAS



Rainy-Day Pivot

- ▶ Chase the sun — drive to the South side, often dry when the North Shore rains
- ▶ Tour Limahuli Valley & Preserve — light rain is often ideal there
- ▶ Cook locally sourced meals at home and recharge
- ▶ Chill on the covered lanai — listen to the rain in the canopy and the river
- ▶ Visit Wai'oli Hui'ia Church, then explore Historic Hanalei
- ▶ Drive Hanalei Valley — rain makes the taro fields and mountains glow
- ▶ Spa afternoon at the Hanalei Day Spa — rain and a massage is hard to beat

⚠️ 7 COSTLY MISTAKES

01

Staying on the Wrong Side

Po'ipū is a nice resort anywhere. The North Shore is the real Kaua'i.

02

Skipping Hā'ēna Reservations

Ke'e Beach requires advance passes. Book at gohaena.com exactly 30 days prior — they sell out within hours.

03

Renting a Tiny Car

A convertible is cute until you're stuffing paddleboards into it. Midsize SUV. Always.

04

Ignoring the Ocean

North Shore surf gets massive in winter. Check surfline.com daily or call the Kauai marine forecast 808-245-6001.

05

Over-Scheduling

This is Kaua'i, not a theme park. The magic lives in slow mornings and spontaneous paddles.

06

Eating Like a Tourist

Skip Google's top picks. Hit Hanalei Farmers' Market, try food trucks, cook fresh fish or try a Luau.

07

Booking a Hotel, Not a Home

A hotel gives you a bed. At River Estate you'll experience Kauai in the real old style. The most expensive mistake of all.

DAY 4 River + Kalalau

Kayak from the property to the ocean. Float home. Afternoon: hike the first stretch of the Kalalau Trail together.

Sleep in. Do nothing at all. Relax at the house. The best couples' trips stop keeping score and start keeping memories.

COUPLES PICK

The Guest House was designed for two. Balinese decor, river sounds, total seclusion. Private lanai overlooking the water. You won't want to leave — and honestly, you shouldn't.

COUPLES PICK

Sunset at Kē'ē Beach — Bring a bottle of wine, a blanket, and zero expectations. The sky does the rest.

Hanalei Pier at sunset — A 10-minute walk from end to end, but you'll want an hour.

FAMILY PICK

Hanalei Bay (summer) — Gentle waves, wide sand, lifeguards. Sandcastle heaven.

FAMILY PICK

'Anīnī Beach — Protected reef pool. Kids spot sea turtles. Safe and unforgettable.

FAMILY PICK

Kē'ē Beach lagoon — Calm snorkeling water, Nā Pali trailhead nearby for older kids.

BEYOND THE BEACH

- ✓ **Kayak the river** — Right from property. Safe, easy, the story they'll tell first.
- ✓ **Limahuli Garden** — Shaded, educational tropical botanical garden.
- ✓ **Nā 'Āina Kai** — Treehouse, hedge maze, log cabin. Kids go wild.
- ✓ **Pick fresh fruit every morning** — Tangerines, oranges, grapefruit and mango from the property in season.



FAMILY-FRIENDLY ITINERARY

Waimea Canyon drive — kids love the "Grand Canyon of the Pacific."

SECTION 06

Beaches & Water Guidance

Not every North Shore beach is for swimming – and that's okay. Here's how to choose the right one for your day.

Scenic & Look-Don't-Swim

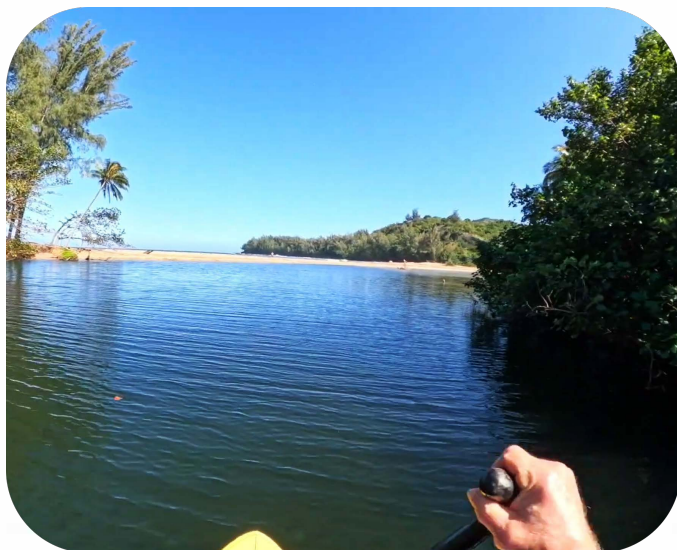
Queen's Bath, West end of Lumahai Beach and Hanakapi'ai Beach during Winter swells. These are for photographs, reflections, and respecting the ocean's power. Enjoy the views from the shore. Never turn your back on the ocean.

Family-Friendlier

Hanalei Bay by the pier, 'Anīnī Beach, Kē'ē Beach lagoon and Tunnels Beach. Gentle entry, lifeguards at Hanalei, reef-protected coves. Still: watch your kids like you would anywhere. Conditions change fast.

Best Snorkeling

Tunnels Beach (Best north shore snorkeling) and 'Anīnī Beach. Tunnels has a protected reef lagoon with sea turtles. 'Anīnī is shallow, safe, and the green sea turtles are unfazed by your presence. Arrive before 8 AM for the best conditions.



Winter Hazards

November–March brings massive North Pacific swells. Even calm-looking beaches can have sudden “sneaker waves.” Never swim alone. Watch the water for 10 minutes before deciding. If it looks sketchy, it is.

Summer Conditions

May–September: the ocean calms significantly. Hanalei Bay becomes a giant swimming pool. Tunnels reef is placid. Kayaking is ideal. This is prime time for paddle-to-beach adventures right from River Estate.

★ FAST FACTS

-  Kauai marine report daily before any water activity in Winter.
-  Book Ke'e Beach passes at gohaena.com 30 days ahead. It's a must do experience.
-  Winter: expect big surf. Anini Beach and Hanalei by the pier are safest swimming spots during big swells.
-  Summer: Generally calm conditions except where wind can be a safety factor due to unsafe wind swell.
-  'Anīnī Beach best chance for safest swimming and possible sea turtle sightings of all swimming areas.

⚠ Important Water Safety

Wainiha Beach where the river meets the ocean has strong currents and is not recommended for swimming. Your paddle from River Estate takes you to a different, safer stretch. Always ask Mark about current conditions.

SECTION 07

Reserve This Early

Most visitors don't book until it's too late. Here's your reservation checklist — with timing.

⚠️ RESERVE EARLY

- ▶ Hā'ēna State Park pass at gohaena.com — 30 days ahead, sells out same day
- ▶ Helicopter tour (Blue Hawaiian or Safari) — 2–3 months ahead in peak season
- ▶ Nā Pali catamaran cruise — 4–6 weeks ahead, summer fills fastest
- ▶ River Estate vacation rental — 6–12 months ahead for peak weeks
- ▶ Bar Acuda dinner reservation — 30 days ahead, non-negotiable
- ▶ Car rental — midsize SUV, book as soon as flights are confirmed

★ MARK'S MASTER TIMING GUIDE

12+ months out: Lock in River Estate (peak season goes fast)

3–6 months out: Helicopter, catamaran, tubing adventure, car rental

30 days out: Hā'ēna State Park, Bar Acuda

1 week out: Confirm travel arrangements, weather forecast & ocean report from Mark

Pro tip: Set calendar alerts for the 30-day and 90-day marks. You'll be glad you did.

📅 SEASONAL NOTES

Peak Seasons: March–April (Spring Break), June–September (Summer), Thanksgiving week, mid-December–January (Christmas). Everything books earlier; rates are generally higher.

Shoulder Season: January–March, April–May, September–mid November. Fewer crowds, better rates.

Off-Season: February–March, May–June, early–mid December. Lowest rates.

Special Events: Happen year round — check your dates online.

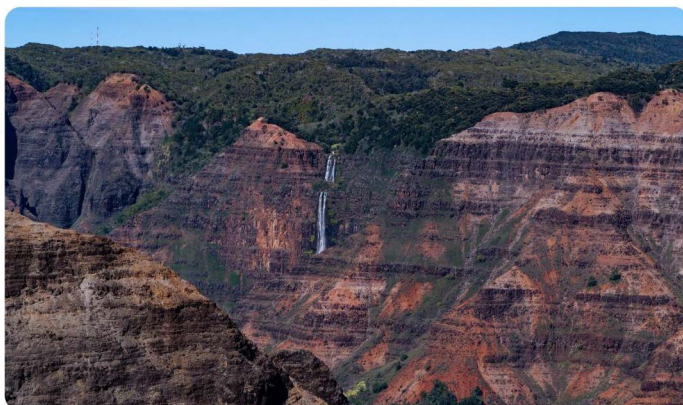

Food, Coffee & Easy Wins

I have eaten at all these places myself. Skip Google — here's where the best food is.

BEST EATS ON THE NORTH SHORE

Tahiti Nui

Hanalei's legendary bar and grill. Live music, mai tais, unchanged vibe since the 1960s. Don't miss it.

Bar Acuda

The best dinner on the North Shore. Tapas, local ingredients, serious wine list. Book 30 days ahead — not kidding. My favorite.

Postcards Cafe

Known for its fresh island seafood, gourmet vegetarian dishes, locally sourced produce and creative Pacific Rim cuisine. Another favorite of mine.

Dolphin Restaurant & Fish Market

Largest fresh fish selection and local specialties at the market, plus a local steak house by the Hanalei river.

Hanalei Market

A well-stocked health food store specializing in organic and local items, plus a coffee bar and hot food station.

Pat's Taqueria Food Truck

Simple, fast, absurdly good. Locals eat here multiple times a week. \$5 gets you a meal you'll remember. By the Hanalei Pier.



Kilauea Fish Market

Local poke, fresh plates, and a lunch crowd that tells you everything about quality. Go early before it sells out.

Big Nick's

Casual eatery with Hawaiian-style dishes such as burgers and chicken plates. Best local plate lunches in Hanalei.

Hanalei Bread Company

Healthy breakfast choices, the best pastries and quality coffee in Hanalei. Get there early. Porch seating and free WiFi.

Kauai Juice Co.

Cold-pressed juices from local fruit. Perfect recovery after a big hiking day.

Ama Restaurant

Gourmet noodle house in the heart of Hanalei — bowls of ramen, steamed buns, and cocktails. Covered lanai seating.

Hanalei Farmers' Markets

Every Saturday morning and Tuesday afternoon. The best local produce, fresh flowers, and food vendors. This is the real Hanalei.

★ MARK'S NOTE

Your secret weapon is the River Estate kitchen. Buy fresh catch from Dolphin Fish Market, grab produce from the Saturday market, and cook dinner on the lanai as the sun sinks behind the mountains. That meal will be the one you remember most.

SECTION 09

Adventures Most Visitors Miss

Every tourist walks the same path. These experiences live around the bend — and they're worth everything.



- Helicopter Tour of the Island**
 Book an early flight on Blue Hawaiian out of Princeville or Jack Harter out of Lihue. Once-in-a-lifetime.
- Nā Pali Coast Boat Tour**
 Book a snorkel tour on a catamaran or rigid-hull Zodiac out of Hanalei (May–Sept) or Port Allen the rest of the year.
- Mountain Tubing Through Lava Tunnels**
 Kauai Backcountry Adventures. Float through carved 1870s aqueducts and lava tunnels. The most popular activity on Kauai — book well in advance.
- Reserve Your Time at Haena State Park**
 Book exactly 30 days out. See the best sunsets on Kauai and hike the Kalalau trail. Life-defining.
- Snorkel with Turtles at Tunnels Beach**
 The premier Kauai shore dive location, right down the street from River Estate. Get there early for the prime parking spots.
- Surf Lesson at Hanalei Bay**
 Even if you've never surfed, summer conditions are forgiving. Hawaiian Surfing Adventures rents boards and runs solid beginner lessons right on the bay year round.
- Kīlauea Lighthouse**
 Red-footed boobies, nesting albatross, nēnē geese. Best wildlife spot on Kaua'i.
- 'Okolehao Trail**
 Short, steep hike off the main road. Panoramic views of Hanalei Valley and Bay. Well worth the effort.
- Pick Fruit From Your Garden**
 Pick fresh fruit in season — all growing on the River Estate property. No hotel offers this.
- Hanalei Strings Music Night**
 Local and mainland musicians drop by and perform free concerts in an intimate room. Call for times and get there early.

★ MARK'S NOTE

The adventure most visitors miss is the simplest one: doing nothing. Sit on the lanai. Watch the river. Listen to the birds. Kaua'i has a way of filling your cup when you stop trying so hard.

★ MARK'S ADVICE TO FIRST-TIMERS

Don't try to do everything. Pick 2–3 adventures max for a week-long trip. Leave the rest for next time — and trust me, you'll want a next time.

SECTION 10

Respect the 'Āina

Kaua'i is not a theme park. It's someone's home — sacred land cared for since antiquity. Visitors who understand this leave changed.

★ VISITOR ETIQUETTE

Take Only Memories

Don't leave trash. Don't pick flowers/fruit from public lands. Stay on marked trails. This 'āina is alive — treat it with respect.

Drive With Aloha

One-lane bridges. Narrow roads. Roosters crossing. Wave when someone lets you through. It's not optional — it's how we live here.

Learn the Language

Mahalo (thank you). *Aloha* (hello/love). *'Ohana* (family). *Kuleana* (responsibility). Locals notice and appreciate it.

Support Local First

Farmers' markets. Food trucks. Local shops. Tip generously. The year-round community makes this place what it is.

Ocean Safety

Never swim alone. Never turn your back on the water. Check the surf and weather reports. If locals aren't in the water, conditions might not be safe. If in doubt, find a beach with a lifeguard.

I've been a steward of this land since 1970. Every day I walk the property and pick up the smallest piece of litter. Not because anyone asked — because that's kuleana. When you stay with me, you're part of that care.

What Is Kuleana?

Kuleana (koo-leh-AH-nah) means reciprocal responsibility. Not just owning something — caring for it because you're connected to it. When you visit Kaua'i, your kuleana is to honor the place and people who make it special.

⚠ Local Beach Note

Wainiha Beach (the river mouth) has strong currents at times. It's a place of beauty, yet it can be rough. Enjoy the view, take photos, paddle in the river — always respect the ocean's power.

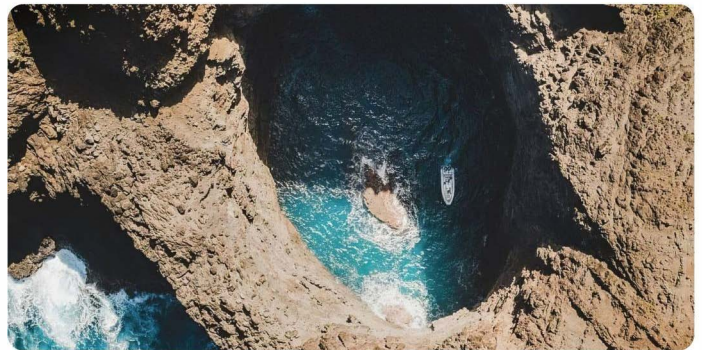
